In 1996, I ventured to New Zealand's South Island in search of uncrowded surf breaks and the crisp, dry snow of the Southern Alps. After completing my studies in Adventure Tourism at Tongariro National Park, I began exploring opportunities to start my own sea kayaking operation.

An article in New Zealand Surfer magazine about Kaikōura piqued my interest, and I decided this coastline could be the perfect location to establish Kaikōura Kayaks. While Kaikōura already had a thriving tourism industry with operators like Whale Watch Kaikōura, Dolphin Encounter, and Kaikōura Helicopters, there were no kayaking companies at the time.

Cycling along the Kaikōura Peninsula, I was instantly captivated by the abundance of marine life, breathtaking scenery, and dramatic coastline. I knew Kaikōura was the ideal place to launch my business and call home.

In 1998, after two years of planning, saving, obtaining a marine mammal viewing permit, and building up a fleet of kayaks, Kaikōura Kayaks became a reality as the first licensed kayak operator in the region. We pioneered the popular half-day guided sea kayaking tour and later introduced a family-friendly tour with guaranteed fur seal sightings and opportunities to encounter dusky dolphins and blue penguins.

Over the past 26 years, Kaikōura Kayaks has successfully showcased the region, leaving lasting memories for countless visitors. Remaining a family-operated business with my wife Kim and daughters, along with a dedicated and passionate crew, Kaikōura Kayaks continues to thrive.


- Equipped with a hydrodynamic rudder system that allows for easy steering

Sea sickness is often experienced, and even in slight seas some customers can become ill. We recommend taking medication to combat this prior to the tour. We also sell Sea Sickness bands.

Winter Kayaking

Crisp, calm days and majestic views greet our paddler's in Winter. It's the best time of year to really appreciate how close the Seaward Kaikōura Range is to our marine playground.

- Clients stay warm and dry in enclosed stable sea kayaks.
- All equipment provided including GORE-TEX dry pants, jackets, wetsuit booties for their feet, gloves and dry bags for camera's.
- Chance encounters with Humpback Whales on their annual migration (June-September).
- Departs 8:30am & 12:30pm, 3:30pm(May only).
- May-August.









Annual Humpback Migration

Autumn and Winter are the best time of year for viewing Humpback Whales as they migrate along the East coast of the South Island.

- These gentle giants spend their summers in the waters of the Antarctic, feeding on krill and schooling fish.
- We are lucky enough to encounter them on their migration to and from their mating grounds in the Tropics.
- We are the only kayak company in Kaikōura with a permit to view Humpbacks.





Christmas Day

Most attractions in Kaikōura are closed on the 25th of December so we are delighted to be able to offer two tour options.

- Departs: 8:30am & 12:30pm only.
- Look out for seals hunting for their favourite feed of Octopus (Christmas dinner).
- Special rates apply.
- Limited numbers.
- 1.5 to 2 hours on the water allow 3 hours.

- The journey starts with spotting the Christmas trees around Kaikōura. The Pōhutukawa is the Kiwis own special Christmas tree.
- It can grow to be very large and has bright red flowers which are popular decorations and feature on Christmas cards. It has been associated with Christmas since the mid-1800s.
- The Pōhutukawa has great importance in Māori culture.
